It was the decision of the delegates and alternates that public notification of the open position be started immediately, with a deadline of accepting applications for December 13, 1991. That will be followed with a special meeting of the LaSalle County V.A.C. on Tuesday, December 17, 1991. The Superintendent will notify all applicants who passed the original screeing of the above mentioned time frame and their required presence at that special meeting. Ron Cummings reported that the Plano Vietnow Chapter had called him announcing that they would be putting on a program at the LaSalle Veterans Home. To date they have raised \$500 for their activities and are asking for additional veterans groups to assist them with that endeavor. They need additional volunteers as well as cash donations for prizes. Any group that can help can call John Walters at 815-496-2210.

Ron then shared with us the letter from Senator Paul Simon pertaining to lifting of the economic embargo with Vietnam. Senator Simon feels that this will help resolve numerous problems that our nation is enduring. They are as follows:

- 1) It will resolve the MIA/POW issue.
- 2) It would prevent millions of Vietnamese from fleeing in boats from Vietnam which is forcing the fee nations of the world to endure additional costs in order to provide for those peoples needs.
- 3) It would help our American investors because other nations of the world are already trading with Vietnam and are exploring the natural resources that Vietnam has to offer. This could help our nation economically. It is no longer to our advantage to continue with our sanctions.

Senate Bill 1348, "The Vietnam Access Act of 1991", will permit us to lift the imposed embargos. Motion by Ralph Adler, seconded by Bob Anderson, that our veterans groups do not support S.B. 1438. Motion passed unanimously.

At the request of Charles Klever (LaSalle County Board member and a member of the LaSalle County Veterans Assistance Commission Committee), I am providing information from the LaSalle County Veterans Assistance Commission meeting of April 10, 1991 with the request that Cindy Decker's salary be increased to \$18,000 a year for additional services provided to our office.

Superintendent Rue was asked what the status of our Service Officer, Jim Soberri was at the present time. He explained the current status. VAC Delegate Robert Anderson, asked if we could hire another Service Officer to replace Soberri. Our Superintendent suggested that it may not be advisable at this time to terminate a person who is disabled until we have determined the total extent of his disability. It is not advisable to terminate an employee who is out on full disability. Delegate Anderson asked how we could possibly do all our casework without another Service Officer when we couldn't keep up with the workload when he was here? Superintendent Rue stated that Cindy has been filling out many of the VA forms that our clients need completed. This has been a great asset to me in my advocacy work. Delegate Ralph Adler stated that she should be adequately compensated for the additional work that has been placed upon her. He asked what her total responsibilities are in our VAC Office. In brevity she does the following:

- 1. All paperwork required and qualifying of those veterans' requests for General Assistance, medical payments, and transportation.
- 2. Listens to the needs of all clients and suggests what state or federal agency might be able to assist their needs.
- 3. Takes dictations and helps prepare the documentation I need to continue my advocacy work.
- 4. Fills out those needed VA forms at my request or the request of our clients and if necessary, contacts the VA Regional Office pertaining to questions.

Motion by Ralph Adler, seconded by Bob Anderson, that due to the extensive responsibilities, which are placed on our Administrative Assistant, Cindy Decker, that the Commission insist that her salary be raised to \$18,000. Motion passed unanimously.






