


Dear Representative Gordon:

State of Illinois Representative Jack D. Franks for the fifth year has introduced H.B. 1139 which would correct the grave disparity in our State's disabled veterans "PROPERTY TAX CODE STATUTE", which denies many of our 100% service connected disabled veterans who are rated permanent and totally disabled by the United States Department of Veterans' Affairs their property tax exemption. I would ask you to sign on as a co-sponsor of H.B. 1139 if you have not already and ask your colleagues to also co-sponsor this legislation. The current state statute discriminates against 100% service connected permanent and totally disabled veterans by dividing them into two separate 100% disabled classes instead of treating them as equals. I know of no other State that says we will treat these 100% service connected disabled veterans better than these 100% service connected disabled veterans because one group must have made a greater sacrifice than the others. By not treating 100% service connected disabled veterans as equals they are saying we will provide this property tax exemption for these few and we will punish those other 100% service connected totally and permanently rated 100% disabled veterans for not sacrificing enough. To me, as a combat veteran, that is no different than saying if you are engaged in a battle and were killed by friendly fire you are not entitled to an honorable military burial as the soldier is that died in the same battle from enemy fire. Please correct this unjust statue now by seeing that H.B. 1139 gets passed now.

As of March 23, 2007 H.B. 1139 was re-referred to the Rules Committee. This is where a bill is sent to die. Please see that it is brought out of the Rules and passed by the House of Representatives. We are counting on you and your colleagues to see that H.B. 1139 becomes law this year. We need your help now.
