Veterans Assistance Commission minutes of December 9, 1987

John R. Cawley opened meeting in due form. All officers were present. Minutes were read by the alternates and delegates present. Motion by John Sadowski and seconded by Arnie Anderson that minutes be accepted, motion passed.

Old Business was then discussed. Carl Kirar made a motion which was seconded by Ed Wroblewski that a resolution be drafted and submitted to the County Board members stating that the VAC request that our VAC office pay transportation costs for all veterans traveling to VA hospitals for medical assistance. VAC feels strongly that veterans, who meet the national poverty level as far as accountable income, should be eligible for mileage reimbursement at a rate of 20 cents per mile from our transportation line item, due to the fact that the VA has eliminated their mileage reimbursement for anyone within a radius of 100 miles. Motion passed unanimously.

Delegate Kirar reported on Mantino Skill Care Unit. He stated that a veteran had to remain at home due to health problems had become a total invalid. His family then transferred him to Mantino, because they could not provide his needed care. After a short stay the veteran started showing major improvements. The care at Mantino that he received was excellent. To date, he is now reaching the point of being ambulatory. Carl was very pleased with the improvement of this veterans health situation. It was further stated by our Superintendent that due to lack of funding by our State Legislators, Mantino is approximately short 38 needed staff personnel. Our VA Home in Quincy is short approximately 23 hospital personnel. We must make our people and our legislators aware of this dire shortage in order to insure the best possible care to our deserving comrades.

Mike Shelton stated that he was concerned about a trade off that the Building and Trades Council made on their past contract. He stated that they had decided to trade the holiday Armistice Day for an extra vacation day at Thanksgiving. If any veteran did not show up for work on Armistice Day that could be fired. He did not feel it was fair to fire a veteran who took off Armistice Day in order to pay tribute to those living and dead soldiers. It was the consensus of the VAC delegates and alternates present to bring this concern to the Concerned Veterans of the Illinois Valley.

Mike Shelton stated that the Ottawa Nam Vets have collected numerous magazines. They will be willing to give those to any veterans who will take them to Hines VA Hospital.

Ralph Adler brought to our attention the limited charter for members and families of Bakelite Credit Union. He stated that the Director of this Credit Union wish to expand their boundaries due to the closing of the plant. This Credit Union has served the Ottawa area for more than 35 years. In order for them to remain in business they must expand their boundaries and open their membership to other people. He further read a letter from Major Small from the City of Ottawa, which encouraged the Credit Union's expansion. He asked the Commission for their support for this needed expansion. A motion was made by Ralph Adler that the VAC Superintendent draft a letter endorsing the Bakelite Credit Union directors desire to expand the boundaries and membership. Motion seconded by Sam Maggio, motion passed unanimously.

Receivership should not concern us at this point in time, because if it is meant to happen, we cannot prevent it. I would recommend that we comply with the County Board VAC Committee's request. Numerous additional questions pertaining to the intergovernmental agreement were answered. Motion by Francis Perra and seconded by Nate Barnhart that we turn down the requests for the intergovernmental agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

The Commission then proceeded with the election of officers for the year 1988. A motion by Ed Wroblewski that we should slate the same officers that we had the previous year. Joe Gerace seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Work on veteran memorial to stop

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (AP) — An effort by Vietnam veterans to raise \$100,000 to complete a memorial honoring the nearly 3,000 Illinoisans who died in the war has failed to meet its goal, organizers say.

Dennis Guernsey, chairman of the memorial's advisory board, said Thursday "money would have to fall out of the sky" to prevent the project at the Oak Ridge Cemetery from being stopped in a few days.

Memorial organizers won't know until today exactly how short their latest fund-raising effort is.

Publicity about the memorial's money shortage helped fuel \$13,000 in donations this week, Guernsey said, but that was offset by a lower-than-expected corporate donation.

Enough money has been raised to have the memorial's granite blocks inscribed with the names

of Illinois' war dead and to have the stones delivered to Springfield, he said.

The stones and remaining memorial materials will be kept in storage until the \$100,000 is raised.

The monument, to be near Abraham Lincoln's burial site, will be circular-shaped, with five black granite walls and five interior courtyards.

Architect Gary Likins said the construction is at a logical stopping place, and the delay should not add significantly to the memorial's overall cost.

Guernsey said that if enough money does arrive "in a short period of time" the veterans may decide to have the walls of the memorial erected and then cover them during winter until the rest of the project is ready for a dedication ceremony.

"The dedication itself is as im-

portant to us as the actual construction," he said.

Because of the money problems — and expected delays brought on by bad weather — it may be next Memorial Day before the monument is dedicated, he said. Next month had been set for the tentative dedication.

Veterans supporting the memorial indicated three weeks ago if they did not have the money by Thursday, work at the cemetery site would cease.

The project's general contractor, R.D. Lawrence Construction Co. of Springfield, said it needs the money to pay subcontractors.

Veterans had hoped the cemetery's board would furnish the money by returning \$100,000 of a \$200,000 deposit they gave the board to maintain the memorial once it was built.

Veterans contend the deposit was more than needed for the

memorial's maintenance, but acknowledge the cemetery has given no indication the money will be refunded.

"There's absolutely no signs at all they're going to do that," Guernsey said. "They continue to see this memorial as a liability."

Cemetery officials have said the veterans' group did not make the \$200,000 figure an issue last year when they agreed to pay it.

Most of the construction funds for the \$1.25 million memorial project came from a \$485,000 state grant.

The only major corporate sponsor has been the G. Heileman Brewing Co., which offered 10 cents for every case of Old Style or Old Style Light sold in Illinois in July and August.

The offer raised \$28,000, \$14,000 less than veterans had hoped the promotional campaign would generate.

County Board still won't budge on request to hike Rue's salary

A pay raise for the Veterans Assistance Commission superintendent was voted down again Monday by the La Salle County Board.

VAC Superintendent Martin Rue wants his annual salary increased from \$21,000 to \$26,500. When he began making the request several months ago, he asked for \$35,000 but has since modified the amount to \$26,500 — the amount paid to most of the county's elected office holders. The sheriff earns \$43,000 and the state's attorney \$65,500.

Rue has threatened to sue the county if he doesn't get a raise. The Veterans Commission supports his efforts and half a dozen area veterans attended Monday's meeting. Board member Ario Franzetti, D-Ottawa, asked that a motion he made previously be brought back on the floor. His motion to approve Rue's request was tabled in

January. The Board refused his request, voting 14-8. After the vote, Franzetti chastized his colleagues for not discussing the matter. He also said that conversations with the state's attorney's office lead him to believe the county may have to appoint Rue a legal counsel if he decides to file suit.

"We may be costing ourselves more money in litigation than we would be in granting the veterans' wishes," he said.

Sam Maggio, a La Salle resident active in many veterans' organizations, then told the board that saying he is disappointed is "putting it mildly."

Board members Erwin "Moose" Hageman, R-Peru; Kenneth Krogulski, R-La Salle; Orlando Smith, R-Oglesby; Paul Poulakos, D-Ottawa; Gerald Hanley, D-Ottawa; and Mel Novak, R-Streator, joined Franzetti in his effort to bring the matter up for discussion. All others voted no. Robert McFadden, R-Streator, was out of the room when the vote was taken.

County Board refuses to reconsider raise for Rue

Despite the appearance of seven or eight veterans at Monday's La Salle County Board meeting, the board voted not to talk about a salary hike for Marty Rue.

After three and a half hours of discussing other matters, the board voted not to resurrect Rue's demand for a salary adjustment for himself and his full-time assistant.

Rue, superintendent of the La Salle County Veteran's Assistance Commission, wants his salary increased from \$21,000 a year to \$26,500, the same as the county's elected officials. His assistant's salary should be raised from \$9,828 to \$14,000, he has said. The Concerned Veterans of the Illinois Valley support both pay increases.

Rue is responsible for helping indigent veterans who qualify for need and assistance. He is elected by the VAC delegates.

Ario Franzetti, D-Ottawa, made a motion at the board's January meeting to grant the adjustment but the motion was quickly tabled in a 20-6 vote.

R. Pete Bradley, R-Streator, chairman of the board's Veterans Assistance Committee, said he has made Rue a compromise offer, "but he won't even talk to me."

Moments after the board had voted 14-8 Monday not to bring the issue off the table, "disappointed" veteran leader Sam

Maggio of La Salle addressed the board. It appeared Maggio took the board's refusal to discuss the raise as a personal affront to war veterans.

"To say I am disappointed puts it mildly. It has failed again a second time; I can't understand it. You will not make me feel sorry for what we did (overseas)," said the World War II veteran.

"I am 66 and I'd go again tomorrow, believe me." Maggio praised the Rue for being accessible and dedicated.

"Marty Rue believes in what he is doing. You can call him at 2, 3 in the morning and he will be right there to help a veteran who needs to get to a hospital," he said.

Maggio said he could remember at least three times when Rue was contacted by desperate wives and family members of dying veterans. The terminally ill veterans were facing removal from a hospital, Maggio said.

"Those men were not moved. They are dead and gone now but they died with honor. They didn't get pushed out like a dog thanks to Marty."

Maggio asked the board to reconsider the salary adjustment. "Reconsider it again . . . Don't treat (veterans) like second class citizens."

This shows that our elected officials finally recognized the fact that veterans organizations must be listened to also. Ten years ago we would have never been considered to take part in such festivities.

Motion was made by John Sadowski, seconded by Ralph Adler to adjourn the meeting, motion passed.

County Board still won't budge on request to hike Rue's salary

A pay raise for the Veterans Assistance Commission superintendent was voted down again Monday by the La Salle County Board.

VAC Superintendent Martin Rue wants his annual salary increased from \$21,000 to \$26,500. When he began making the request several months ago, he asked for \$35,000 but has since modified the amount to \$26,500 — the amount paid to most of the county's elected office holders. The sheriff earns \$43,000 and the state's attorney \$65,500.

Rue has threatened to sue the county if he doesn't get a raise. The Veterans Commission supports his efforts and half a dozen area veterans attended Monday's meeting. Board member Ario Franzetti, D-Ottawa, asked that a motion he made previously be brought back on the floor. His motion to approve Rue's request was tabled in

January. The Board refused his request, voting 14-8. After the vote, Franzetti chastized his colleagues for not discussing the matter. He also said that conversations with the state's attorney's office lead him to believe the county may have to appoint Rue a legal counsel if he decides to file suit.

"We may be costing ourselves more money in litigation than we would be in granting the veterans' wishes," he said.

Sam Maggio, a La Salle resident active in many veterans' organizations, then told the board that saying he is disappointed is "putting it mildly."

Board members Erwin "Moose" Hageman, R-Peru; Kenneth Krogulski, R-La Salle; Orlando Smith, R-Oglesby; Paul Poulakos, D-Ottawa; Gerald Hanley, D-Ottawa; and Mel Novak, R-Streator, joined Franzetti in his effort to bring the matter up for discussion. All others voted no: Robert McFadden, R-Streator, was out of the room when the vote was taken.

County Board refuses to reconsider raise for Rue

Despite the appearance of seven or eight veterans at Monday's La Salle County Board meeting, the board voted not to talk about a salary hike for Marty Rue.

After three and a half hours of discussing other matters, the board voted not to resurrect Rue's demand for a salary adjustment for himself and his full-time assistant.

Rue, superintendent of the La Salle County Veteran's Assistance Commission, wants his salary increased from \$21,000 a year to \$26,500, the same as the county's elected officials. His assistant's salary should be raised from \$9,828 to \$14,000, he has said. The Concerned Veterans of the Illinois Valley support both pay increases.

Rue is responsible for helping indigent veterans who qualify for need and assistance. He is elected by the VAC delegates.

Ario Franzetti, D-Ottawa, made a motion at the board's January meeting to grant the adjustment but the motion was quickly tabled in a 20-6 vote.

R. Pete Bradley, R-Streator, chairman of the board's Veterans Assistance Committee, said he has made Rue a compromise offer, "but he won't even talk to me."

Moments after the board had voted 14-8 Monday not to bring the issue off the table, "disappointed" veteran leader Sam

Maggio of La Salle addressed the board. It appeared Maggio took the board's refusal to discuss the raise as a personal affront to war veterans.

"To say I am disappointed puts it mildly. It has failed again a second time; I can't understand it. You will not make me feel sorry for what we did (overseas)," said the World War II veteran.

"I am 66 and I'd go again tomorrow, believe me."

Maggio praised the Rue for being accessible and dedicated.

"Marty Rue believes in what he is doing. You can call him at 2, 3 in the morning and he will be right there to help a veteran who needs to get to a hospital," he said.

Maggio said he could remember at least three times when Rue was contacted by desperate wives and family members of dying veterans. The terminally ill veterans were facing removal from a hospital, Maggio said.

"Those men were not moved. They are dead and gone now but they died with honor. They didn't get pushed out like a dog thanks to Marty."

Maggio asked the board to reconsider the salary adjustment.

"Reconsider it again . . . Don't treat (veterans) like second class citizens."

Work on veteran memorial to stop

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. (AP) — An effort by Vietnam veterans to raise \$100,000 to complete a memorial honoring the nearly 3,000 Illinoisans who died in the war has failed to meet its goal, organizers say.

Dennis Guernsey, chairman of the memorial's advisory board, said Thursday "money would have to fall out of the sky" to prevent the project at the Oak Ridge Cemetery from being stopped in a few days.

Memorial organizers won't know until today exactly how short their latest fund-raising effort is.

Publicity about the memorial's money shortage helped fuel \$13,000 in donations this week, Guernsey said, but that was offset by a lower-than-expected corporate donation.

Enough money has been raised to have the memorial's granite blocks inscribed with the names

of Illinois' war dead and to have the stones delivered to Springfield, he said.

The stones and remaining memorial materials will be kept in storage until the \$100,000 is raised.

The monument, to be near Abraham Lincoln's burial site, will be circular-shaped, with five black granite walls and five interior courtyards.

Architect Gary Likins said the construction is at a logical stopping place, and the delay should not add significantly to the memorial's overall cost.

Guernsey said that if enough money does arrive "in a short period of time" the veterans may decide to have the walls of the memorial erected and then cover them during winter until the rest of the project is ready for a dedication ceremony.

"The dedication itself is as im-

portant to us as the actual construction," he said.

Because of the money problems — and expected delays brought on by bad weather — it may be next Memorial Day before the monument is dedicated, he said. Next month had been set for the tentative dedication.

Veterans supporting the memorial indicated three weeks ago if they did not have the money by Thursday, work at the cemetery site would cease.

The project's general contractor, R.D. Lawrence Construction Co. of Springfield, said it needs the money to pay subcontractors.

Veterans had hoped the cemetery's board would furnish the money by returning \$100,000 of a \$200,000 deposit they gave the board to maintain the memorial once it was built.

Veterans contend the deposit was more than needed for the

memorial's maintenance, but acknowledge the cemetery has given no indication the money will be refunded.

"There's absolutely no signs at all they're going to do that," Guernsey said. "They continue to see this memorial as a liability."

Cemetery officials have said the veterans' group did not make the \$200,000 figure an issue last year when they agreed to pay it.

Most of the construction funds for the \$1.25 million memorial project came from a \$485,000 state grant.

The only major corporate sponsor has been the G. Heileman Brewing Co., which offered 10 cents for every case of Old Style or Old Style Light sold in Illinois in July and August.

The offer raised \$28,000, \$14,000 less than veterans had hoped the promotional campaign would generate.
